A dancer's artistry is only as strong as their physical and mental health. Thanks to donor support, **Colorado Ballet's Dancer Wellness Program** provided essential care and resources that kept Company Dancers healthy and ready to perform at their best.

"This season, I broke my fifth metatarsal on my left foot during a stage run of Sleeping Beauty. My biggest concern when I first got injured was having a long recovery. I thought everything was going to feel different, and that I was going to be afraid to jump on the foot. I came back in about five weeks, and that was due to our health and wellness team. Education & Community Engagement

The Education & Community Engagement department offers programs to students least likely to access dance independently and for whom it could have the greatest impact. The department reaches over 67,000 students and educators and 3,000 schools and organizations each year, nationwide. Programs include after school dance education, Sensory Friendly performances, school assembly programs and student matinee performances.



DIGITAL BROADCASTS

Digital Broadcasts bring the magic of Colorado Ballet beyond the Ellie—at no cost to viewers. From classrooms to community centers to living rooms, audiences enjoy live hosts, dancer interviews, behind-the-scenes access, and even an intermission lesson on ballet pantomime.

Each broadcast is paired with an educator guide full of activities and learning tools. Schools can also book movement workshops, ensuring students experience the joy of dance—especially important where arts access is limited.

Next steps include Spanish translations, American Sign Language, and an archival library, giving more people more ways to experience ballet.

Colorado Ballet Premier Society members support our mission with gifts of \$1,500 or more. Members engage deeply in the programs they support through Society benefits like amazing events, special performances, dance focused travel, and behind the scenes tours.

The 2024/25 Season featured a diverse array of engagement opportunities including studio and dress rehearsals, a *Nutcracker* backstage tour, an exclusive Colorado Ballet Academy performance, and opening night parties.

Leadership Council




