ACT I

Hermia and Lysander are very much in love. When Hermia's father Egeus demands she marry Demetrius with the blessing of Theseus, the Duke of Athens, Hermia is distraught. She wants to marry Lysander. Demetrius is pursued by Helena but is in love with Hermia. When he rejects Helena she becomes upset. Helena sees Hermia and Lysander run away together to the woods and tells Demetrius who proceeds to follow them, Helena close behind.

The sprites and fairies of the kingdom gather at the court of Oberon and Titania, the King and Queen of the Fairies. Meanwhile, the lovers wander through the woods as Puck, Oberon's servant, watches them.

Titania and Oberon arrive to their court with Titania's attendant, an indian changeling child. Oberon admires her attendant and insists Titania give the child to him. Titania refuses and leaves, taking the child with her.

Enraged, Oberon tasks Puck with finding a flower which causes the victim to become infatuated with the first person they lay eyes on. Demetrius enters the clearing followed by Helena, and Oberon conceals himself. While Demetrius searches for Hermia, Helena does her best to get his attention but is cast aside. Seeing all of this, Oberon follows them thinking he may be able to help.

Meanwhile, Puck is in search of the flower. He finds it and brings it back to Oberon. Oberon then sends Puck off to use a petal from the flower on Demetrius and Helena.

Lost in the woods, Hermia and Lysander search for somewhere to rest. They pick a spot and Hermia sends Lysander off to sleep at a respectable distance. In flies Puck, who mistakes Lysander for Demetrius and uses the magic of the flower on him.

Demetrius and Helena enter the clearing. Demetrius rejects Helena a final time and leaves her despondent. Helena then finds Lysander sleeping in the clearing and wakes him. Under the spell of the flower, Lysander sees Helena and falls madly in love, following her further into the forest. When Hermia wakes she finds Lysander is missing and runs off to find him.

Four villagers become lost, watched over by Oberon and Puck. The two choose Nick Bottom as their unwitting victim, turning him into a donkey and scaring off his friends. They then lead him to where Titania is resting, their plan now in motion.

ACT II

Still in search of Lysander, Hermia stumbles upon Demetrius. She demands to know where Lysander is. Getting no response from him, Hermia storms away. In need of rest, Demetrius finds a nice spot in the clearing and lays down to sleep. Thinking he can fix the error made by Puck, Oberon finds a sleeping Demetrius and dusts the flower pollen in his eyes.

In rushes Helena being pursued by Lysander. She wakes Demetrius to help her and he too falls in love with her. Now being pursued by both men, Helena tries to fight them off. As she struggles, Hermia enters the clearing and attempts to help Helena and reclaim to affection of Lysander. Fighting ensues between the four individuals.

In order to rectify Puck's mistake, Oberon hypnotizes the lovers and places them to sleep with their correct partners. Oberon then wakes Titania to teach her a lesson. Having been awoken and seeing the beast she has slept with, Titania feels foolish and agrees to give the changeling child to Oberon. They set off into the forest followed by Puck who changes Bottom back into a human before leaving.
